The governing body of the City of Roberta met in a regular session with Jay Andrews calling the meeting to order 6:00 pm.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

INVOCATION: The invocation was given by Robert Cody.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: The agenda was presented and a motion was made by Sherry Thompson to accept, second by Robert Cody, vote was unanimous.

MINUTES September 17: Robert Coy made a motion to approve the 17 September minutes as written and was seconded by Will Carroll. The vote was unanimous.

INCOMING NEW BUSINESS: Everything Vintage Consignment Shop – A motion was made by Brant Bailey to approve and was seconded by Robert Cody, vote was unanimous.

OLD BUSINESS:

Notice was given for the police department to notify the Vaquero Tire needs to get tires removed from the business outside.


NEW BUSINESS:

- Les Wood a local boy scout requested to replace a bent flag pole in David Bailey park as his Eagle Scout project. A motion was made by Will Carroll and seconded by Robert Cody. The vote was unanimous.
- A request from F.A.T. Ministries was made to cook hot dogs and feed the community on Nov. 8. A motion was made by Brant Bailey to approve and it was seconded by Josh Patterson. The vote was unanimous.
- Hometown Heroes – Pat Bailey presented a project for recognizing our hometown heroes with banners to hang from the lights through out the city. She agreed to organize the sale and ordering of the banners. The banners will hang from May through November 11 each year. The motion was made by Josh Patterson to accept the project and seconded by Sherry Thompson. The vote was unanimous.
- Waste Management – Price increase on garbage collection. Notice was received effective October 1, 2025 the rate would increase by \$1.50 each container. Council voted to increase customers effective January 1, 2026. A notice to be included on November and December billing. Motion was made by Brant Bailey and seconded by Robert Cody. The vote was unanimous.


- New Mayor Josh Patterson requested a new time for meetings effective January 1, 2026. A motion was made by Josh Patterson and seconded by Brant Bailey for meetings to move to 6:30 pm start time. The vote was unanimous.
- Will Carroll presented a possible grant opportunity – Sidewalk and Brush Grant – he will work with Greg Boike to get more information with this to possibly include the sidewalk we are planning for East Agency St and the clearing of the brush in our outlay areas in the city. More information to come.
- Bids for the repair of men’s restroom were presented – iPlumber \$1785.00 and J&J \$1800.00. A motion was made by Josh Patterson to accept J&J for the repair. A second was made by Brant Bailey. The vote was unanimous.
- Deep Well Repair – The deep well at Zenith Mill was repaired by DJ Pump Service – the total was \$20969.10 to be paid from the Renewal & Extension funds.
- Kawasaki Mule – Repairs – Capital Cycle made repairs to the side by side for \$3238.59 this is to be paid from the vehicle and Equipment funds.
- Vacuum Pump – Replacement – A quote from Atlas Copco Vacuum for 3375.00 was accepted. A motion was made by Josh Patterson and seconded by Brant Bailey. The vote was unanimous.
- Excavator – Purchase – Quotes were received for a Kubota with 6 way blade of \$67,700.00 and a CAT with an angle blade \$75,664.00. Both of these prices include a government discount. The equipment would be purchased with SPLOST funds. The current Bobcat would be posted on the Georgia Procurement website and the Georgia Post for sale. Council had a few questions, the purchase decision will be tabled until November meeting when these questions can be answered.
- Lean To – Quotes were received from three contractors to add a lean-to on the current shop building. This would be used to park vehicles and cover equipment. Southern Oaks Construction bid \$18,190.10, Simplified Roofing Solutions bid \$26,576.43 and Bibb Home Improvements bid \$52,000.00. Council accepted Southern Oaks bid with a motion made by Brant Bailey and seconded by Robert Cody. The vote was unanimous.
- Bailey Sidewalk – Repair – Bid was received by Southern Oaks Construction of \$5,975.00. Motion was made by Robert Cody to accept and was seconded by Sherry Thompson. The vote was unanimous.
- Police Vehicles – Purchase – Chief Ty Matthews brought a quote from Brannen Ford to purchase two new police vehicles. The total for two Ford Interceptor Explorers is \$135,267.00. Council voted to make the purchase using SPLOST funds a motion was made by Brant Bailey and seconded by Sherry Thompson.

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
With no further business a motion was made by Brant Bailey to adjourn, a second was made by Robert Cody at 8:00 pm. The vote was unanimous.




