INVOCATION: An invocation was given by Josh Patterson.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: The agenda was presented a motion was made by Sherry Thompson to accept, second by Robert Cody, vote was unanimous.

MINUTES March 16: Minutes were presented – A motion was made by Arnita Harris to accept and a second was made by Will Carroll, the vote was unanimous.

INCOMING NEW BUSINESS: An application from Pretty Hustle Treats & More was presented to open business on Wright Ave. A motion was made by Robert Cody to accept and seconded by Sherry Thompson with a contingency on final approval from P&Z. Vote was unanimous.

OLD BUSINESS: None to discuss

PUBLIC HEARING: Will Carroll made a motion to enter into a Public Hearing and Robert Cody seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous.

- Tammie Graumann from Planning and Zoning read the proposed text amendments to be added to the City Land Use Guidelines.
- Text Amendment for 7.3a – Offroad Parking was read (the land use guide is available online) A motion was made by Robert Cody to approve the amendment with a second by Arnita Harris. The vote was unanimous.
- Text Amendment for Article 2 – Log Term Storage to C1 (the land use guide is available online) A motion was made by Will Carroll to approve the amendment with a second by Sherry Thompson. The vote was unanimous.

Will Carroll made a motion to exit public hearing and return to regular session. Second was made by Robert Cody. Vote was unanimous.

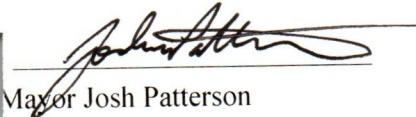
NEW BUSINESS:

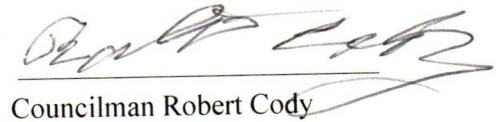
- Cammie Sanchez from MGRC was present to give a report on two engineering firms that submitted portfolios for the procurement request. The two firms with the best record were Carter & Sloope and Hofstadter with an 8 point

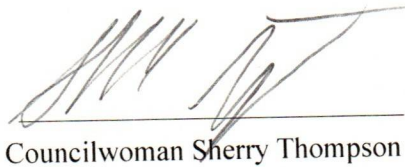
difference the city chose Carter & Sloope. A motion was made by Robert Cody with a second by Sherry Thompson. The vote was unanimous.

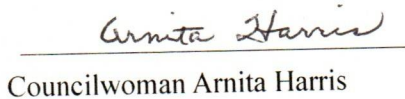
- The K-9 grave in the back yard of city hall has been damaged, Rooks Memorial came out and gave us a quote to clean and repair the memorial for \$200.00. Will Carroll made a motion to accept the bid and Robert Cody seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.
- City Siren: Josh Patterson received a quote for getting the city weather siren back in operation. To begin with the backup batteries for the system need to be replaced at a cost of \$936.64. Reconfiguring the current system is \$450.00. This system would be manually activated inside of city hall. Total cost for the manual option is \$1386.64.
The second option is to change to an automatic activated system. To upgrade to this system would be \$6596.28, plus the replacement of the backup batteries at \$936.64, and would require a yearly subscription to the automation service at \$930 annually. Council opted for option two – a motion was made by Will Carroll and seconded by Robert Cody. The vote was unanimous.
- Street Repairs – Striping – quotes will be requested for the striping of Winifred Rd, McCrary Ave and Kirby Ave.

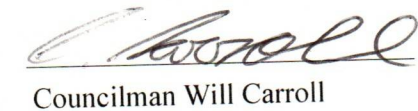
With no further business a motion was made by Robert Cody to adjourn, a second was made by Sherry Thompson at 7:27 pm. The vote was unanimous.

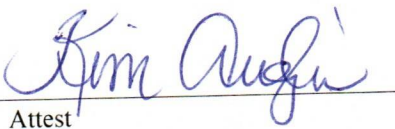
